RUSTIC ROADS ADDITIONS

In April, Gov. Tony Evers, together with the WisDOT, announced two new additions to the Rustic Roads Program, which features lightly traveled scenic routes throughout the state.

"Since its inception in 1973, the Rustic Roads Program has encouraged folks to get outside and enjoy scenic routes in every corner of the state," said Gov. Evers. "No matter where you go or what season you travel, Wisconsin's rustic roads underscore the rich history of our state and highlight the vast and vibrant natural resources that we are working hard to preserve for future generations to enjoy."

One new route, Rustic Road 125, is a mix of pavement and gravel for 9.4 miles near the American Birkebeiner Trail in Northwestern Wisconsin's forests. R-125, which is comprised of Telemark Road and Spider Lake Fire Lane, curves along hilly, glaciated country through Bayfield County and Sawyer County Forests. The Namekagon River and a network of trails for mountain

biking, cross-country skiing, and all-terrain vehicles cross the route.

The other addition, Rustic Road 126, crosses Honey Creek in Walworth County and passes what was once a one-room schoolhouse. R-126, which runs along Bell School Road and a portion of Hillburn Mill Road, features sweeping agricultural vistas, preserved farms, and woodlots. The nearby Honey Creek Streambank Protection Area offers 251 public acres for hiking, hunting, fishing, canoeing, birding, and cross-country skiing. Bell School No. 7, originally a one-room schoolhouse, is on the Wisconsin Architecture and History Inventory.

In total, the 126 Rustic Road routes span approximately 760 miles in 61 counties. Rustic roads range from two miles to 37 miles in length and have a maximum speed limit of 45 miles per hour. Unique brown and yellow signs mark the routes of all officially designated rustic roads.


REMEMBERING MAC MACDONALD


